Zhejiang Provincial Government Special Researcher, professor and PhD supervisor of the School of Public Health of Zhejiang University, expert with special government allowance of the State Council of China, national high-end think-tank distinguished researcher, ARAHE executive committee member (head of east Asia), academic committee member of the "Collaborative Innovation Center for Social Organizations and Social Governance" jointly built by the province and the Ministry, Vice Chairman of the Expert Advisory Committee of "Healthy Zhejiang Action", Chairman of Zhejiang Home Economics Education Union, Honorary Chairman of the Social Medicine Branch of the Chinese Preventive Medical Association, etc.

Research interests: Social medicine and health policy, life quality evaluation, health management of vulnerable people, etc.

Title of Thematic Message 1:

The Mission of Future Community and Home Economics on Chinese Path to Modernization

Abstract: China has achieved moderate prosperity. It is moving to common prosperity led by modernization, and future community construction has become the basic condition and platform for realizing a better life. 3.Home Economics into Communities to Provide Modernized Livelihood Services




Akiko UENO, Ph.D., Professor, Kinjo Gakuin University

Dr. Akiko Ueno is a Professor at Kinjo Gakuin University, College of Human Life and Environment, Department of Life Management, in Nagoya Japan. Her research specialty is school home economics education, especially in the fields of family studies and consumer education. She received a Ph.D. in Secondary Education from the University of Alberta, Canada, in 2002. Dr. Ueno also has a Master degree in Education from Yokohama National University in Japan. She is a writer and editor for the Japanese government approved high school home economics textbooks as well as book chapters and academic research papers. For many years, she has been continuingly active with international comparative research projects in home economics education. In 2022, Dr. Ueno was awarded the Japan Association of Home Economics Education 'Association Award' for her research on "Home Economics Education in Canada and Multicultural Education in Home Economics."

Title of Thematic Message 2:

Nurturing empathy through home economics education in Japan by instructing diversity in everyday life culture

Abstract: Japan has been experiencing a drastic population decrease. The total population is predicted to decline to half its current number before the 22nd century. On the other hand, there is an increase of people coming from overseas to live in Japan, as well as an increase in the number of Japanese people living abroad. Children of this century, regardless of their nationality, will inevitably be exposed not only to the culture of their birth country but also to the diverse cultures of other countries. It is crucial to identify strategies for addressing challenges that arise from cultural differences encountered in schools and society. Research conducted in Canada has highlighted key considerations for promoting multiculturalism among students, within the context of home economics. As a result, multicultural education materials and lesson plans have been developed and implemented in junior high home economics classes in Japan. In a world increasingly defined by its multicultural nature, securing one's livelihood will be challenging without striving for coexistence and understanding beyond the interests of oneself and/or one's own country. Cultivating empathy through the deliberate recognition of commonalities among different cultures is essential.

Dr Rahimah JAMALUDDIN, Senior lecturer, Universiti Putra Malaysia

Rahimah Jamaluddin started her career as a senior lecturer at the Department of Science and Technical Education, Faculty of Education Studies, Universiti Putra Malaysia in 2013. She has extensive experience in the field of Technical and Vocational Education. Her major is in Home Science, and she taught courses related to Fashion and Clothing, Food Service, and Family Life Education. She is the coordinator for the master's and Ph.D. programs in Technical and Vocational Education. Recognized for her excellence in teaching, she received the Vice Chancellor's Fellowship Award as Young Instructor in 2015. Since 2018, she has actively engaged in teaching and learning innovation competitions at national and international level, winning numerous awards including 10 gold medals, 12 silver medals and 6 bronze medals. She is also actively involved in carrying out activities of industry and community networking. She has handled 92 industrial and community projects. Two of her projects received High Impact Industry Network Awards in 2017 and 2018. She is the exco of the Malaysian Association of Home Economics (MAHE).
